Exam Findings:

Lethargic and anemic
No apparent injuries

Possible neurological issues or visual deficit determined by difficulty in locating and consuming food.

Diagnostic Workup Findings:

Moderate anemia
Elevated muscle enzymes indicating muscle exertion, high potassium and low blood protein.

Radiographs (x-rays):

Small amount of gas present.
Given barium impregnated pellets (to determine gut mobility)



TREATMENT FOR:

Mulligan

(MAY BE PREVIOUS OR CURRENT)

IV fluids for dehydration

Tube feeding for nutrition

Itraconazole (antifungal)

Amakacin (antibiotic)
